Leadership With Real Results

Kennedy Keeps Our Children Safe From Sexual Predators

- Introduced and passed legislation to expand GPS ankle bracelet monitoring by 100 percent, allowing for the tracking of an offender's whereabouts at all times, and preventing them from entering "exclusion zones," such as school grounds.
- Worked to protect children from online predators by providing free ComputerCOP software, which enables parents to scan their child's computer for potentially threatening websites and materials.

Kennedy Is Tough on Illegal Aliens

- Worked with County Executive Levy to address the influx of illegal aliens on the local level, without waiting for federal government action.
- Opposed the use of any use of government funds to create hiring halls for illegal alien day laborers.
- Supported County Executive's measure requiring employer's to verify the legal status of employees.
- Co-signed a letter to Police Commissioner Dormer calling for the department to enforce current state loitering and vehicle traffic laws, which would prevent the obstruction of traffic by illegal alien day laborers soliciting prospective employers.

Kennedy Maintains Our Quality of Life

- Worked with community leaders to establish neighborhood watch areas to help local residents preserve the safety for all community members.
- Co-sponsored a ban on the sale of medicines with Dextromethorphan (DXM), a drug young adults use to get high.
- Supported the Police Department's policy to arrest persons driving without a license.
- Worked with Fourth Precinct COPE unit officers for stronger enforcement of county laws governing bars and night clubs, resulting in more than 150 summonses at the VIP Lounge in Nesconset.
- Obtained new body armor for county police, allowing decommissioned equipment to be sent to troops in Iraq and Afghanistan for added vehicle protection.
- Obtained body armor for county probation officers.
